£900 - Female sports personality came in to speak to the whole school and run workshops linked with athletics. Pupil voice has shown that more girls are wanting to try athletics and feel they could be good at it.

£600 - Children are more aware of what a healthy lifestyle is. Highlighting the importance of physical activity, however also demonstrating there are other ways in which they need to look after themselves.

There has been an increase in physical activity across the school and more children walk on Wednesdays than any other day.
