Parent/Carer Agreement

The governing body of Perry Wood Primary and Nursery School and Oscar staff aim to provide the following:

- A safe, caring and stimulating environment.
- High quality care at all times.
- Experienced, qualified and committed staff.
- A varied programme of activities for your child.
- A commitment to equal opportunities.
- Safe equipment which meets British standards.
- Policies and procedures which meet Ofsted requirements.
- Availability to discuss the care of your child at a mutually convenient time.
- Strong partnerships with parents/carers
- To provide children with a nutritious breakfast and/or a nutritious meal and drink at the after school club.

Organisation

The Breakfast Club is open Monday-Friday from 7.30am– 8:45am.

The After School Club is open Monday-Friday from 3:30pm – 5.45pm

- The Clubs are available for all children from Nursery age to Year 6.
- The Clubs are located in the dining hall.
- Parents/carers are asked to enter and collect their children via the side door to dining room for breakfast club and afterschool club.
- Parents/carers are asked to agree to and sign a contract alongside a registration document for both clubs prior to booking.

Breakfast Club

Children must be dropped off at the dining hall door by an adult, doors will open at 7.30am.

Children will get a choice of cereals, toast and pastries to begin their day.

Parents/carers are responsible for informing the Breakfast Club Leader of any dietary requirements. After the children have eaten, they will have the opportunity to get involved in a number of activities.

These include: Board games, Lego or construction games, Comics or books, Craft, drawing, or puzzles, the children can be heard reading or help with homework.

At the end of the session at 8.45am, children in Early Years and KS1 will be taken to their respective classrooms by staff, KS2 children will be supervised on the playground or taken to their classroom.

After School Club

Children attending Oscars will be collected from class at 3.15pm and taken to the dining hall for registration.

Following registration in Oscars, any child attending a separate afterschool club will join the other children attending the club, at 4.30pm they will be brought back to the Oscars.

A light snack will be offered at 4.30pm if required.

Parents/carers are responsible for informing the After School Leader of any dietary requirements.

Typical activities will include: Art and craft (painting aprons/shirts will be provided) Sports, team games using the hall or playground, computer skills, cooking, a wide variety of reading resources is available, lego and construction games along with board games to help with homework, and support can be offered for reading and homework.

Parents/carers can donate toys and games to the Oscars, but children should not bring anything valuable from toys from home, staff cannot be held responsible for the loss or damage to any personal items.

Payment

Payment for both clubs MUST be paid in advance and by using the Squid app or government schemes, if payment has not been received then access to the provision will be withheld until payment has been received.

If you are late in picking up your child from Oscars we ask that you call to let the staff know your estimated time of arrival, late pick up charges are enforced, if your child is collected significantly late on more than 3 occasions in one half term you will no longer be able to access our provision.

Behaviour

The school rules and behaviour policy apply to both clubs pupils. We expect good behaviour and respect for others. We use various techniques to encourage good behaviour including praise, rewards stickers.

The Head reserves the right to withdraw the access to Oscars if a child's behaviour is consistently unacceptable. If a child displays inappropriate behaviour persistently they can be removed from Oscars permanently.
